July 28–August 4

We are holding a camp, “Act for the Future,” for Christian medical professionals from all over Ukraine. Next Generation Professional Leaders Initiative (NGPLI) leaders will lead seminars and workshops on serving Christ through their profession.

August 1-4

Denis Gorenkov, who directs Mission Eurasia’s NGPLI, will train 60 youth leaders from eight churches to minister more effectively to professionals during seminars at a youth camp in Melitopol, Ukraine.

August 19-20

Denis Gorenkov will participate in a summer project for Christian medical professionals in western Ukraine. He will preach and present Mission Eurasia resources on ministering in the workplace.

Hear their stories!

Across Eurasia, our School Without Walls (SWW) leadership development program is training and equipping Next Generation leaders to impact lives for Christ this summer. Three children in Russia shared about their summer Bible camp experience and how SWW leaders touched their lives.

Artem: “Recently I received a Gospel of John at a summer camp. I started reading it and I had many questions. Although I didn’t understand everything, I kept on reading and I started seeing changes in my life. One of the things I read was that I need to obey my parents... I am trying to do that but I still sometimes fail.”

Edik: “When I first started reading the Gospel of John, I was so absorbed in reading it that I didn’t notice the time and read it to the end. I want to become Jesus’ disciple to be wise.”

Lev: “I often quarrel with my brothers and have a hard time getting along with them. I understand that it’s not right. When I read about Jesus, who forgives people who genuinely come to Him, I also wanted that forgiveness. I want to learn to forgive my brothers, always tell the truth, and believe in God.”
