You are Invited to Share Joy and Hope with Hurting Ukrainian Refugee Children this Winter!



hen Russia attacked the peaceful nation of Ukraine on February 24, 2022, unimaginable suffering and destruction were unleashed, devastating millions of innocent lives. Since the start of the war, more than 7 million Ukrainians have been internally displaced (IDPs) and more than 10 million Ukrainian refugees have fled to neighboring countries for safety. Approximately half of these hurting and traumatized refugees are children.

That's why this Orthodox Christmas season, which is celebrated in early January 2023, Mission Eurasia is mobilizing volunteers, including School Without Walls students and graduates, as well as local church workers, to carry out a largescale evangelistic outreach in Moldova called Gift of Hope for Ukrainian refugee children affected by the war in Ukraine.

Through Gift of Hope, volunteers will help pack and deliver special gift boxes filled with toys, treats, and most important of all, a children's Bible or other copy of children's Christian literature in the Ukrainian language to refugee children who are celebrating their first Christmas away from home in a foreign land. A special evangelistic Christmas program will be organized through our Refugee Assistance Center in Moldova, where refugee children will learn about Jesus, the greatest gift of all, and the hope and peace He offers to them.

This winter, Mission Eurasia invites you and groups from your church to take a hands-on role in delivering joy and hope—the message of Jesus—to Ukrainian refugee children who have suffered from war in their homeland. On our mission trip to Moldova, you will enjoy fellowship with national Christians, witness the life-changing ministry of Mission Eurasia firsthand, engage in personal evangelism, and serve as the hands of feet of Jesus to children in need.

The eternal impact of this trip will extend far beyond the Orthodox Christmas season, so please consider whether God is leading you to join us in this Kingdom work. This mission trip is perfect for individuals, families, groups, or churches to serve together and experience the fellowship and hospitality of believers in Eurasia. Each group is led by experienced Mission Eurasia staff, and professional language interpreters will be available to facilitate communication.

Room and board: \$100 per day, or \$900 for nine days

Transportation and translation: \$25 per day, or \$225 for nine days

Total: \$2,425*

Additional Requirements

The first payment of \$1,000 is due on November 1, 2022. The remaining balance of \$1,425 is due on December 1, 2022.

All participants must have a valid passport and be 18 years of age or older, unless accompanied by a parent or guardian. A third-party background check will be performed on all adult applicants.

COVID vaccines are not currently required to participate, and all COVID restrictions have been lifted in-country. Trip participants will be notified if these requirements change at a later date.
